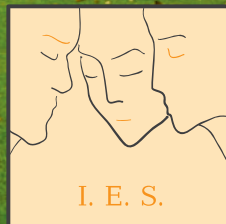

3

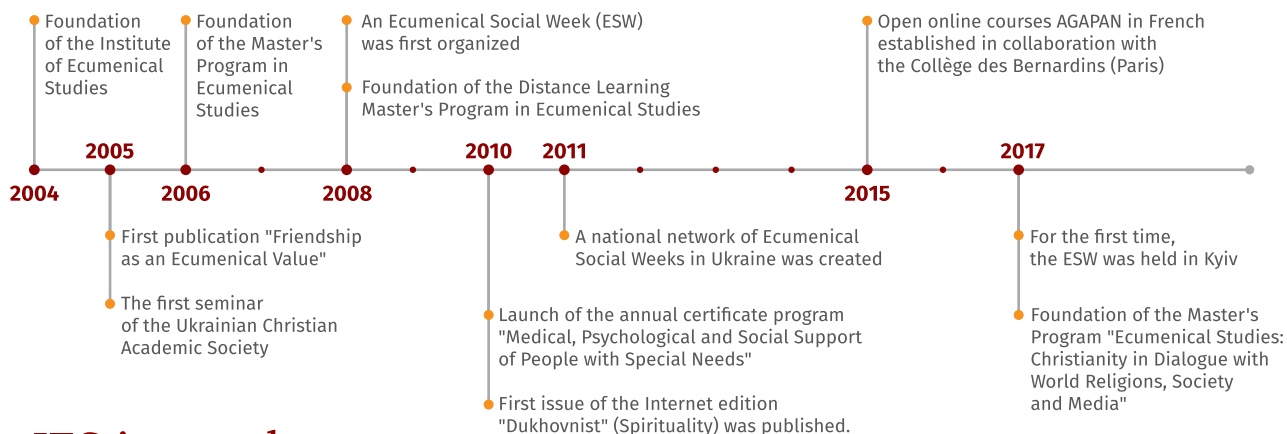

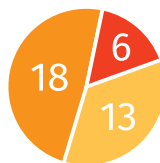

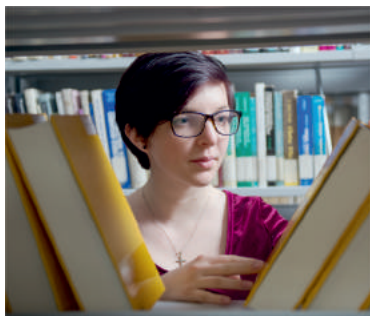

Distance Learning Master's Program in Ecumenical Studies (DLMPES)

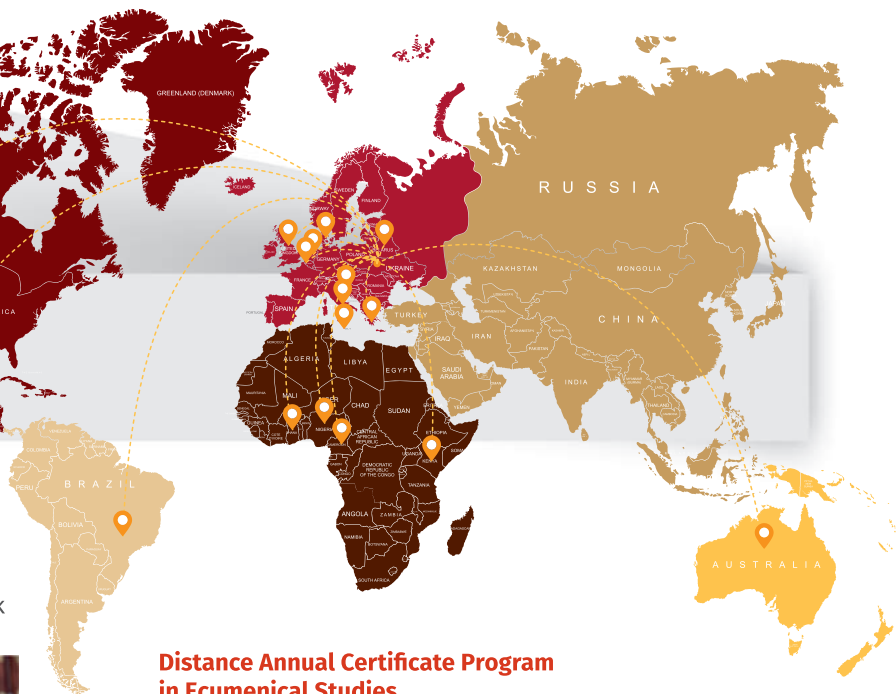
- provides theological and ecumenical education at the master's level through on-line learning

Annual Educational Certificate Program "Medical, Psychological and Social Support of People with Special Needs"

(people with different kinds of special needs: dependent, elderly, sick, terminally ill, lonely)

The purpose is to provide support for people with special needs in the light of a new vision of a person.

Priority directions:

1 Interaction and interplay of the accompanying person and the person who is being accompanied



2 Work in the team

3 Personal responsibility: participation in the process of humanization of society



550 training hours

250 hours of formation

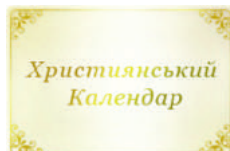

2016 – The book "The Council of Florence" by Fr. Joseph Gill took the 16th place among the best books of the Forum.

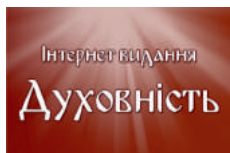
Christian Calendar

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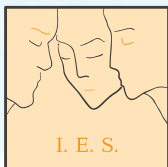
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
